SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION SURVEY OF LOUDOUN COUNTY

This study has been made, at the request of the Division Super-intendent of Schools, for the purpose of indicating the routes to be traveled by the school buses while transporting pupils to the high and elementary centers. The results of this study are thown by two means. First, by giving a detailed written description of the routes; second, by tracing a visual description of the routes on a county highway map.

White Transportation

Information obtained from the office of the division superintendent for the session 1952-53 indicates there were enrolled 2658 elementary pupils and 985 high school pupils. Of this number, there were transported 1738 elementary and 613 high, a total of 2351 pupils. These pupils were transported in 32 buses, for a daily distance of 1269 miles, with an average of 39.7 miles per day per bus. The average pupil load per bus was 73 per day.

Following the information as to the location of high and elementary centers, there will be transported to these centers 2723 high and elementary pupils for a total distance of 1634 miles daily, with an average of 43.3 miles per day per bus. These buses will transport an average of 72 pupils per bus per day and will serve the schools 71 times, with an average of 38 pupils per load per service. The above mileage is based on the actual miles pupils travel from the point—the first pupil is picked up in the morning to the point where the last pupil is discharged in the afternoon. The above recommendation is based on the use of 38 buses,

The map giving the visual description of bus routes and the proposed location of the buildings is to be found in the office of the division superintendent.
